1. **WARM & TOASTY CHRISTMAS TREE** being "decorated" now. Your donations of gloves, mittens, scarves, hats, and socks—colorful or plain—small, medium, or large will help warm some of the needy members of our community.
2. **TOY DRIVE:** The children of Central are having a Christmas toy drive to benefit residents of the New Directions Women's Shelter. Please bring new or gently used toys on Sunday, December 20. The children will collect them during the Children's Focus portion of the Worship Service. The shelter welcomes any toy in new or good condition, excluding used stuffed animals. New stuffed toys are welcomed and encouraged. Toys for children birth through elementary school ages are needed.
